Our long tradition of brewing has produced dozens of private breweries and a trendy craft beer scene in Upper Austria, particularly in the Mühlviertel and Innviertel regions. These breweries are honoured with annual awards - and guests are rewarded with the sophisticated notes of finely crafted ,hop juice'.

A must on the menu is the "Knödel" (dumpling), perhaps filled with light and creamy fish, or spicy minced meat, or sweet apricot.

Whether char from Salzkammergut lakes, crayfish from the River Traun or trout from the Aist, we love our fish freshly prepared. An Enticing Christmas



Infused with the aroma of delicious goodies and brimming with authentic handicrafts, Christmas markets have carved a distinct place in the most peaceful time of year. From the "Glöcklerlauf" (bell walks) to the "Waldweihnacht" (forest Christmas); from the "Schlösser Advent" (Christmas at Lake Traunsee) to the "Steyrer Christkindl" (Steyr Christmas market) or the "Kerzenziehen" (candle making) in Linz. Tip: Try the "Lebkuchen" (gingerbread) at the Wolfgangseer Advent.

Winter Wonderland



Whether gliding through the snow landscape by horse-drawn carriage, stamping uphill on snowshoes to savour marvellous views at the top or reverting to childhood joys on the toboggan, part of the enjoyment is stopping for a snack at one of the mountain huts!

Tip: Find your inner child and get your plastic bag ready. Then, take a seat and take the fast track down the next snow face.

True Handicraft



They still exist: handcrafted objects of outstanding quality. Whether crafted according to patterns passed down through generations or a wholly new design, master craftsmen produce the most extraordinary creations, such as linen and "Blaudruck" (blue printing) in the Mühlviertel. The Salzkammergut too is well-known for its authentic and stylish creations: "Lederhose", "Dirndl", "Goiserer Schuhe" and "Gmundner Keramik" are the best examples of Upper Austrian handicraft.



Style on the River Inn.

Even as far back as the Middle Ages, Schärding was a vibrant trading town for fine goods. The late Baroque building façades, known as the "Silberzeile", bear witness to the wealth of the merchant families.



Tip: Mural Harbor, Urban Cultural Harbour.

Impressive works of graffiti by international artists at Linz Harbour. The harbour gallery – the Mural Harbor – is best visited by boat – or the Graffiti Workshop with an artist in residence.

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All About the Kids

Upper Austria offers its youngest guests plenty of surprises: leaping into cool waters. Sleeping at the Ikuna Naturresort or among the tree tops of the Baumkronenweg. Listening to spine-tingling legends about the Danube and gruesome stories about mountain kingdoms. Grilling "Würstel" (sausage) at the campfire. Sliding down the adventure slides at the Aquapulco outdoor pool. Getting an adrenaline rush on the high ropes course. Playing with the future at the Ars Electronica Center. Petting animals at the farm. And so much more.

Get into Gear



The landscapes are as varied as the ways by which to explore them: trekking bike, racing bike, mountain bike or by utilising a little extra muscle provided by an e-bike. More than 2,100 kilometres of cycling routes take you to inspiring spots, cultural gems and wonderful views. Tip: Take a ride through history on the Römerradweg (Roman Cycle Trail) – to the sites and legacies of Roman times and to the forerunner of the 2018 National Exhibition "The Return of the Legion – Roman Heritage in Upper Austria".

All-terrain Adventure



3,000 km of mountain bike trails in the Salzkammergut, Mühlviertel and Pyhrn-Priel regions certainly need strong calves. The renowned Dachstein-Runde rewards cyclists with magnificent views, while the "Transnationalpark Tour" lays claim to a verdant wilderness at the Kalkalpen National Park and Gesäuse National Park. Dotted along the way are traditional mountain alps and huts.
